Sermon Recap:

The Gift of Children

I. The Divine Architect

- Everything done in your life apart from the Lord will be absolute vanity. This is a principle that is true of all of life, not just family.
- God is the only one who can truly make your home into what it was designed to be.
- The Lord builds the house, he builds the home, he builds the family and the Lord protects what he builds.
- As the Divine Architect, God is the primary builder. We are the secondary builder, fulfilling our role as spouses and parents to build the home.
- Like Solomon, it is possible to hear, know, and write this truth and not follow it.

II. Blessings from the Lord

- "Heritage/Gift"- Children are a gift directly from the architect of all things; not just of the home, but of life itself. He is the giver of children.
- Gift in Hebrews means, "property, possession, that which is shared or assigned." Children are a gift on loan from God.
- "Reward"- Not a moral reward, but something of value. Children are a valuable reward from God meant to remind us of his love and mercy.

III. Arrows in Hand

Children are weapons to be used to advance God's kingdom and glory. We must prepare those arrows.

a. Arrowhead

• Children should be weighty and sharp intellectually and Biblically. We must grand away the dullness by training, teaching, and challenging them.

b. Shaft

• We must evangelize and disciple our children to ensure that they are strong and straight.

c. Fletching

Three Feather:

- Sound Instruction/Doctrine: Train them up in the way they *should* go, not the way they would go.
- Discipline: Sow seeds of obedience and respect that they may be reaped later in home and society.
- Godly Relationships: Surround your children with Godly mentors, friends, and potential spouses.

d. Nock

 Create a tight relationship for your children with yourself, your church, and if the Lord wills, Christ.

Discussion Questions:

- How does the psalmist portray the importance of God's role in our lives, especially in the context of a family?
- "Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain." How does this apply to various aspects of our lives?
- What role do we play in building the house?
- How are children a heritage from the Lord?
- How are children a reward from the Lord?
- How are children weapons in the hands of a warrior?
- Using the "anatomy of an arrow," how to we equip the arrow for it's purpose?

Application:

- What role does the Lord play in your personal home?
- What role do you play?
- Would you say that you have created a culture of obedience and respect?
- How might you create or strengthen that culture?
- Are your children a gift from the Lord? Have you shown them that?
- · How have your children been a reward to you?
- What area of your arrows do you see as a strength? Weakness?
- · How does this Psalm provide you comfort and encouragement?
